Sink Care

There are several levels of product that can be used to remove the water mark depending on what has caused it. Since we are not aware of the source of the mark, we must start with the least abrasive cleaner and graduate to more abrasive cleaners. Contact time is beneficial when using any cleaner, so leaving the cleaner in place for a few seconds before wiping will allow the chemicals to work prior to adding elbow grease.

1. Use of any non-abrasive cleaner such as "Windex" will remove coffee or oily materials.
2. Use of a cleaner similar to "Soft Scrub" can be used. We would recommend scrubbing in a direction the same as the brushing on the sink bottom to minimize appearance changes in the sink finish.
3. Finally, if all others fail, using a "Scotch Brite" pad of minor grit to brush the finish in the bottom of the sink in the same direction of the sink finish brushing will remove any appearance changes in the surface of the sink. If the rubbing is not done in the same direction as the sink brushing, it will be immediately obvious as the contrasting brush marks are readily visible.
